## Public Notice – Environmental Permit

**PURPOSE OF NOTICE:** To seek public comment on a draft permit from the Department of Environmental Quality that will allow the release of treated wastewater into a water body in Lancaster County, Virginia.

**PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD:** July 16, 2021 – August 16, 2021

**PERMIT NAME:** Virginia Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit – Wastewater issued by DEQ, under the authority of the State Water Control Board

**APPLICANT NAME, ADDRESS AND PERMIT NUMBER:** Town of Kilmarnock, PO Box 1357, Kilmarnock, VA 22482; VA0020788

**FACILITY NAME AND LOCATION:** Town of Kilmarnock WWTP, 817 Waverly Avenue, Kilmarnock, VA 22482

**PROJECT DESCRIPTION:** The Town of Kilmarnock has applied for reissuance of a permit for the public Town of Kilmarnock WWTP. The applicant proposes to release treated sewage wastewaters from residential areas at a rate of 500,000 gallons per day into a water body. The sludge will be disposed of to a landfill. The facility proposes to release the treated sewage into an unnamed tributary of Indian Creek in Lancaster County in the Chesapeake Bay and Small Coastal Basin watershed. A watershed is the land area drained by a river and its incoming streams. The permit will limit the following pollutants to amounts that protect water quality: physical and chemical properties, nutrients, metals, organic matter, solids, bacteria, inorganics, and organics. This facility is subject to the requirements of 9VAC25-820 and has registered for coverage under the General VPDES Watershed Permit Regulation for Total Nitrogen and Total Phosphorus Discharges and Nutrient Trading in the Chesapeake Bay Watershed in Virginia (Nutrient GP).

**HOW TO COMMENT AND/OR REQUEST A PUBLIC HEARING:** DEQ accepts comments and requests for public hearing on the draft permit by hand-delivery, e-mail, fax or postal mail. All comments and requests must be in writing and be received by DEQ during the comment period. DEQ must receive hand-delivery and postal mail by close of business and email and fax comments by 11:59 p.m. on the last day of the comment period. Submittals must include the names, mailing

addresses and telephone numbers of the commenter/requester and of all persons represented by the commenter/requester. A request for public hearing must also include: 1) The reason why a public hearing is requested. 2) A brief, informal statement regarding the nature and extent of the interest of the requester or of those represented by the requestor, including how and to what extent such interest would be directly and adversely affected by the permit. 3) Specific references, where possible, to terms and conditions of the permit with suggested revisions. A public hearing may be held, including another comment period, if public response is significant, based on individual requests for a public hearing, and there are substantial, disputed issues relevant to the permit.
