## Hollyday Mint Pie

1 cup crushed Keebler Grasshopper Fudge Mint Cookies, about 21 cookies

3 tbsp hot water

1 (6 oz) Keebler Ready Crust Graham Cracker Pie Crust

1 pkg (3 oz) cream cheese, softened

1/3 cup sugar 2 tbsp milk

1/4 tsp peppermint extract

3 1/2 cups (8 oz) Cool Whip, thawed

6-10 drops green food coloring

Mix cookies and hot water. Spoon into crust and gently spread to cover bottom. Beat cream cheese until smooth; gradually beat in sugar, milk and peppermint extract. Fold in whipped topping. Divide mixture in half; stir food coloring into one half until evenly colored. Fill pie crust with alternate dollops of white and green whipped topping mixtures. Smooth top of pie with spatula. Chill 3 hours.



## Hot Artichoke & Spinach Dip

18 oz. block cream cheese, soft ½ cup mayonnaise

1/2 tsp. minced garlic

1 cup mozzarella cheese, shredded ¼ cup parmesan cheese, grated 1 can artichoke hearts, drained & chopped

2 cups fresh spinach leaves, stems

removed steak seasoning

Serve with bagel chips or other hearty crackers like Triscuits.

Mix first 5 ingredients in a large mixing bowl until combined. Add artichoke hearts and spinach leaves and stir until combined. Spoon mixture into lightly greased pie plate or 1 qt. casserole dish. Liberally sprinkle top with steak seasoning.

Bake at 350 for 25-30 minutes or until bubbly.

# Oyster Rockefeller Soup

6 slices bacon, partially frozen and cut into very small pieces 2 cups finely chopped celery 2 cups chopped onion 1 bay leaf 1/2 cup chicken broth plus some additional broth to use later 3 cups chopped fresh baby spinach

3 cups thinly sliced green onions

1 cups fresh snipped flat-leaf parsley

1 large clove garlic, minced 1/4 tsp. dried thyme 1/2 tsp. dried tarragon 1 tsp. salt 1/2 tsp. pepper 1 tbsp. flour 2 pints of oysters 1/2 cup Pernod 6 cups half and half

In a large soup pot, brown the bacon until fully rendered and crisp. Remove the bacon to drain on paper towels. Throw away all the drippings and leave 2 tbsp. in the pan.

Cook the celery, onions, bay leaf and ½ cup chicken broth in the drippings over medium heat with a lid for 4-5 minutes, or until vegetables are tender. Reduce the heat to low and add spinach, green onions, and parsley. Cook, stirring often, for 4 minutes. Remove the bay leaf. Add garlic, thyme, tarragon, salt and pepper. Cook, stirring often, for 4 minutes. Add flour and cook for 2 minutes. Be sure to scrape the sides and bottom of the pan.

Drain 1 pint of oysters, reserving liquid. Add enough chicken broth to make 1 cup total. Set aside. Increase the heat to medium high and carefully add the Pernod to the veggie mixture. Cook about 4 minutes. Add oyster liquor and the other pint of oysters for 4 more minutes. Cool slightly. Then use an emersion blender to coarsely blend the soup.

Stir in the half and half and cook until the mixture is heated through (do not bring to a boil). Add the remaining pint of oysters and cook for 5 minutes. Serves 12

## 3 Cheese Potatoes Au Gratin

Gruyere cheese Swiss Emmentaler cheese or any good Swiss cheese Edam cheese 1 tbsp. unsalted butter 1 tbsp. avocado oil 1 large yellow onion, cut in half and thinly sliced 1 clove garlic, minced 6 medium potatoes, scrubbed clean salt and freshly ground black pepper 1/4 cup chicken stock 1/4 tsp. freshly grated nutmeg

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F.

Place a box grater in a medium bowl and grate 1/2 cup of each cheese into the bowl. Mix by hand to combine the cheeses. Save the rest of the cheese for another recipe. Melt butter with avocado oil in a skillet over medium heat. Add sliced onion and saute until translucent and caramelized, about 15 minutes. Add garlic and cook another minute. Turn off heat and set aside. Thinly slice the potatoes and place in another bowl. Alternatively, you can also use a mandoline to thinly slice the potatoes. Spray the bottom of a gratin or baking dish with oil. Spoon half of the caramelized onions evenly into the bottom of the dish. Arrange half of the sliced potatoes in a pattern over the onions. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Sprinkle half of the combined cheeses evenly over the potatoes. Spoon the rest of the caramelized onions over the cheese and arrange the rest of the potatoes over the onion. Pour chicken stock over potatoes and add the grated nutmeg. Season to taste with salt and pepper. Sprinkle the remainder of the cheese evenly over the potatoes. Place dish on a baking sheet to catch any drippings. Loosely cover with aluminum foil sprayed on the inside with oil, and bake for 30 minutes. Remove foil and bake another 20 to 30 minutes, until golden brown and bubbly. Serves 4 to 6
